TKU Regulations on the Replacement of Compulsory Course Credits

Secretariat Regulation No. 1130000016 (07/10/2024)

Article 1

The TKU Regulations on the Replacement of Compulsory Course Credits (herein referred to as "These Regulations") were formulated to assist in the handling of all matters related to the replacement of compulsory course credits for students.

Article 2

In the case of the following listed situations, departments, graduate institutes, and degree programs may allow students to apply to take credits for related courses in place of the compulsory course credits:

- 1. A compulsory course is no longer offered.
- 2. There has been a change to the number of credits offered for certain compulsory courses.
- 3. Students who are unable to meet graduation requirements due to a deficiency in compulsory courses (excluding courses such as Learning and Practice of Clubs, Physical Education, All-out Defense Education Military Training, and Nursing) may take a substitute course, subject to approval by the course instructor, the chair of the department, graduate institute, or degree program, and the Dean of Academic Affairs. Only one substitute course may be permitted.
- 4. Courses completed by students prior to transferring departments may only be substituted upon approval by the relevant department, graduate institute, or degree program. Courses completed after the transfer shall be handled in accordance with the provisions of the preceding three paragraphs.

Article 3

Replacement courses and their respective number of course credits are to be determined by each department, graduate institute, or degree program, as well as the college affairs meeting, before being submitted to the Office of Academic Affairs for future reference.

Article 4

If a replacement course from a student's department, graduate institute, or degree program is also offered as an elective course, and if the student's application to take the replacement course is approved, then the number of credits for the said course will not again be calculated in the total of the credits required for graduation by the department, graduate institute or degree program.

Article 5

This set of regulations will take effect on the date of its publication after being passed in an academic affairs meeting. The same applies to any later amendments made.
